On January 7, 2020 at approximately 11:49 am, members of the Nashua Police Department Uniform Field Operations Bureau responded to the Plymouth County Correctional Facility in Plymouth, Massachusetts and arrested Shane Beals, age 43, of 389 Centre Street Dorchester, Massachusetts on an active arrest warrant for Receiving Stolen Property, Class A Felony. Beals had been in custody on unrelated charges out of Massachusetts and waived extradition to New Hampshire. Beals was also charged with two counts of Theft by Deception, Class A Misdemeanor and one count of Receiving Stolen Property, Class A Misdemeanor.

On January 29, 2019 the Nashua Police Department received a report of the theft of numerous items valued in excess of \$1,500 from a local residence. The investigation was furthered by Detectives assigned to the Criminal Investigation Division. During the course of the investigation Beals was identified as a suspect as he had recently been at the residence performing construction work. Further investigation revealed Beals pawned a number of the stolen items at two local pawn shops/ secondhand dealers. Based on the information received during the course of the investigation, Detectives applied for and were granted an arrest warrant charging Beals with one count of Receiving Stolen Property, Class A Felony.

A Class A Felony is punishable by up to fifteen years in State Prison, exclusive of fines. Each Class A Misdemeanor is punishable by up to one year in jail, exclusive of fines. Beals was released on \$250 cash bail and is scheduled to be arraigned on January 16, 2020 at the Hillsborough County Superior Court-South.
