On March 21, 2020 at 1:33 p.m., members of the Nashua Police Department arrested John-Paul Faggons, age 28, of 28 Spalding Street, Nashua, New Hampshire. Faggons was charged with Second Degree Assault– Class B Felony, two counts of Criminal Threatening– Class B Felony, three counts of Criminal Mischief – Class A Misdemeanor and Resisting Arrest – Class A Misdemeanor.

On March 21, 2020 at approximately 1:03 p.m., the Nashua Police Department responded to a residence in Nashua for the report of a disturbance between two individuals known to one-another. Upon arrival officers made contact with John-Paul Faggons outside the residence, who was in possession of two large knives, and actively threatening a victim. After several minutes Faggons surrendered to officers and was taken into custody. Detectives furthered the investigation. It was determined that just prior to police arrival during an incident within the victim’s residence, Faggons threatened the same victim with a knife and during an physical altercation the same victim was injured a knife. Also during this incident Faggons damaged property within the victim’s residence. Faggons damaged an interior sprinkler head while in custody at the Nashua Police Department. The victim sustained minor injuries as a result of the incident. Faggons was also evaluated for a non-life threatening self-inflicted knife wound sustained in this incident.

A Class B Felony is punishable by up to seven years of imprisonment, exclusive of fines. A Class A Misdemeanor is punishable by up to one year in jail, exclusive of fines. John-Paul Faggons was held on preventative detention bail pending his arraignment in the Hillsborough County Superior Court – South on March 23, 2020.
