On March 11, 2020 at 8:01 p.m., members of the Nashua Police Department arrested Matthew Jordan, age 36, of No Fixed Address, Nashua, New Hampshire, on an active warrant for Violation of the Terms of Probation. Jordan was subsequently charged with two counts Receiving Stolen Property, Habitual Offender and Falsifying Physical Evidence, all Class B Felonies.

On March 11, 2020 at 7:35 p.m., a patrol officer observed a motor vehicle travelling on the Daniel Webster Highway in Nashua. The officer made contact with the vehicle and operator, identified as Matthew Jordan, after the vehicle pulled into and stopped in the area of 242 Daniel Webster Highway. It was confirmed the vehicle had been reported as stolen to the Nashua Police Department on March 5, 2020. A records check showed Jordan had an outstanding arrest warrant for Violation of Probation in New Hampshire. He was also certified as a Habitual Offender through the Department of Motor Vehicles. Jordan was placed under arrest. Subsequent searches revealed Jordan was in possession of property stolen from Home Depot and that he had discarded the keys to the stolen vehicle in an attempt to hide them from police. Detectives furthered this investigation and determined Jordan had two prior theft related convictions which upgraded the Receiving Stolen Property charges to felony level offenses.

Each Class B Felony is punishable by up to seven years in State Prison, exclusive of fines. Jordan refused bail and is being held at the Hillsborough Department of Corrections pending arraignment at the Hillsborough County Superior Court - South on March 12, 2020.
