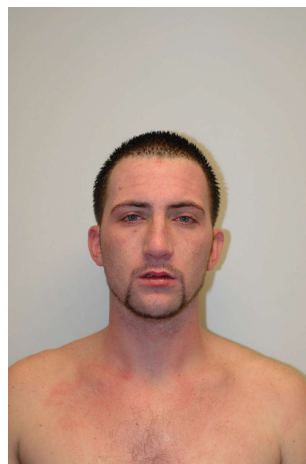

On February 3, 2012 at 11:22 am, members of the Nashua Police Department's Uniform Field Operations Bureau arrested Jonathan Amorella-Moore, age 22 of Hudson, New Hampshire. Amorella-Moore was charged with two counts of Resisting Detention, Class A Misdemeanor and Burglary, Class B Felony.

On February 3, 2012 at approximately 10:59 am, Uniformed Patrol Officers responded to a Nashua residence for a report of a burglary in progress. Upon arrival, Officers searched the residence and located Amorella-Moore hiding inside the residence. He was taken into custody after a brief struggle. The Criminal Investigation Division furthered the investigation and learned that Amorella-Moore had forced entry into the residence and started gathering items to steal.

A Class B Felony is punishable by up to seven years imprisonment exclusive of fines. Each Class A Misdemeanor is punishable by up to one in year jail exclusive of fines. Amorella-Moore is being held at the Nashua Police Department on \$10,000.00 cash or surety bail pending his arraignment at 9<sup>th</sup> Circuit, Nashua Court on February 6, 2012.

Notable in this case was the quick action taken by neighbors. A resident of the Vermont Avenue neighborhood first noted a loud banging sound coming from a Vermont Avenue residence. The neighbor investigated the sound and then saw the male suspect entering through a back door. This neighbor made a further observation that there were no cars in the driveway of the victim residence. The neighbor then called police. It was this quick action and willingness to get involved that led to the quick police response and subsequent arrest. A second neighbor was also helpful in providing additional information; making observations of the suspect outside the victim home.
